#### **Position Overview:**

Guest Services Associates (GSA) at the Katonah Museum of Art (KMA) work as front-line ambassadors to create positive experiences for seasoned audiences and new visitors alike. They provide assistance across in-person, phone, and online channels during regular Museum hours and also assist with special events. GSA staff also serve as gallery guards and ensure that all public spaces are immaculately maintained.

Well-versed in all Museum activities, they actively promote programs and events, collect and report on visitor metrics, and perform other administrative tasks. They are expected to learn about current exhibitions. As valued members of the KMA team, they participate in all audience engagement initiatives to create a welcoming, informed, inclusive, and safe environment for guests.

#### **Specific Responsibilities:**

- Provide excellent service to KMA visitors, welcoming them to the Museum, selling tickets and sharing information about Museum Memberships.
- Work as guards in the galleries, helping to protect the artwork and visitors.
- Effectively and thoughtfully communicate with guests and Museum colleagues.
- Work closely with volunteers and docents.
- Welcome and monitor school groups with the Education Department.
- Answer emails and calls.
- Monitor the phone tree of the KMA as necessary.
- Handle and reconcile daily admissions and event sales.

- Complete daily opening and closing activities.
- Conduct regular walk-throughs of galleries, facility, and campus.
- Ensure restrooms and public spaces (including the Learning Center and Sculpture Garden) are clean and well-stocked.
- Help to sell retail items and refreshments/concessions as necessary.
- Assist with event and program set-up and perform assigned event roles. This may include heavy lifting of 20+ lbs and standing for long periods of time.
- Assist with general administrative duties as needed.

**Qualifications:**

- Candidates should be team players capable of working in a fast-paced professional environment with previous customer service experience and an interest in the arts.
- The position requires availability on weekends and occasional evenings.
- Experience working in the arts or a creative field is preferred.
- Customer service and/or hospitality experience is preferred.
- Strong organizational skills.
- Ability to multi-task and exercise good judgment.
- Knowledge of POS software is helpful.
- Ability to stand for several hours and help set up and take down tables, chairs, etc.
