We are going to the Katonah

Museum of Art, also known as the

KMA. We will enter from the parking
lot through the front door.



As we enter the **Atrium**, we will see the reception desk. A Guest Services Associate (**GSA**) will greet us and check us in. If the Museum feels overwhelming, a GSA staff member can help us find headphones, fidget tools, books, or a quiet place.

The all-gender accessible bathrooms are to the right and left of us.



Past the Atrium is the Marilyn M.
Simpson Sculpture Garden. It is a place to rest or move around. If we bring a snack, we can eat it out there. The tall trees are called Norway Spruce.



The current exhibition at the KMA is **Shen Wei:** *STILL/MOVING*. We can't touch the artwork, but we can look at it!



We will need to stay a safe distance from the artwork and move carefully through the galleries. The GSA staff will also be guarding the room to help protect the art.
