

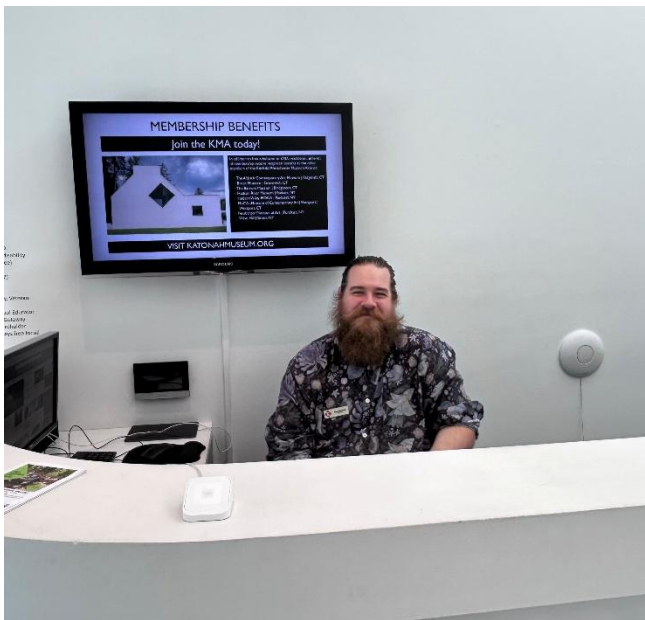


Our Visit to the Katonah Museum of **Art**

We are going to the Katonah Museum of Art, also known as the **KMA**. We will enter from the parking lot through the front door.



As we enter the **Atrium**, we will see the reception desk. A Guest Services Associate (**GSA**) will greet us and check us in. If the Museum feels overwhelming, a GSA staff member can help us find headphones, fidget tools, books, or a quiet place.

The all-gender accessible bathrooms are to the right and left of us.



Past the Atrium is the **Marilyn M. Simpson Sculpture Garden**. It is a place to rest or move around. If we bring a snack, we can eat it out there. The tall trees are called Norway Spruce.

The current exhibition at the KMA is ***Diplomacy at Home: The Domestic Lives of the Founding Families***. We will see furniture and other objects from the homes of the Founding Fathers of the United States of America. This exhibition has low lighting to protect artworks on paper. We can't touch the artwork, but we can look at it!

In **The Pollack Family Learning Center**, we will see ***Tiny Homes: Discover & Design***, an installation for families about ideas of home and the stories objects can tell.
