Katonah, “Ali Banisadr: The Alchemist” (Until June 29)

“Painting still has the power,” Ali Banisadr said on one of the first episodes of The Grand Tourist, “to put you in a state of mind where you’re slowing down, watching for a while.” OG listeners of the podcast will remember the Iranian painter’s reinvigorating faith in painting. There is much to behold in Banisadr’s striking abstractions: Memories of his war-scarred childhood in Tehran, the flair of the graffiti art he painted as a teen, and even an unexpected semblance of Renaissance tableaux. Now, the painter receives a well-deserved major museum survey, his first in the States, presenting painting, drawing, and printmaking from the past 20 years.
